ECUADOR Marlon Santi (m), President of the Sarayaku Association

Marlon Santi, President of the Sarayaku indigenous community in Ecuador Amazon's rainforest and candidate to the Presidency of the Confederation of Indigenous Nationalities of Ecuador, *Confederación de Nacionalidades Indígenas del Ecuador* (CONAIE), received death threats on 21 and 22 December. Amnesty International is concerned for his safety as the threats were made before the CONAIE elections on 23 December.

On 21 December, Marlon Santi reportedly received a threatening phone call whilst he was participating in the second Congress of Indigenous Nationalities and Peoples of Ecuador, *Congreso de Nacionalidades y Pueblos Indígenas del Ecuador*. The anonymous caller said "we are going to kill you", *te vamos a matar*. On 22 December, he received a second phone call early in the morning, again an unknown voice said "desist from your candidacy because you are not going to last even 24 hours in the post, you will stop breathing", *desiste de tu candidatura porque no vas a lograr ni 24 horas en el cargo, se te va a acabar la respiración*.

The death threats have allegedly been reported to the Inter American Commission on Human Rights. In May and December 2003, the Commission asked the Ecuadorian government to protect the Sarayaku indigenous community and their leaders, including Marlon Santi, after their members received death threats and were physically and verbally assaulted. In January 2004, Ecuador's Minister of Energy and Mines reportedly responded to the Inter-American Commission's precautionary measures by stating that "the OAS does not give orders here" "*la OEA no manda aqui*". ## RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send appeals to arrive as quickly as possible, in Spanish or your own language:

- expressing concern at the death threats received by Marlon Santi, President of the Sarayaku indigenous community;
- calling for a full and independent investigation into the death threats, for the findings to be made public, and for those responsible to be brought to justice;
- urge the Ecuadorian government to adhere to its obligations to ensure his safety and that of all indigenous leaders in line with the request made by the Inter American Commission of Human Rights;
- express grave concern that the threats against Marlon Santi and other indigenous community leaders make it increasingly difficult for them to carry out their legitimate work on behalf of indigenous communities.
