Workers at the Lunafil S.A. textile factory in Amatitlán, Department of Guatemala, have reported that on 20 May 1995, Débora Guzmán Chupén received a new death threat. This is the latest in a series of threats and other acts of intimidation against Lunafil trade unionists and workers which began in May 1994, when a group of 49 workers began a protest outside the factory against what they claimed was its illegal and unjustified closure.

Débora Guzmán Chupén, a trade unionist at the $L\ y\ L\ Modas$ factory, is married to Félix González, a leading Lunafil trade unionist. In February 1995 she was abducted, and told that she would be killed if she did not convince her husband to stop his union activities. She was released a day later, and shortly after received a written death threat at her home, warning her to ensure that her husband resigned from the union within 72 hours.

The latest threat has come in the form of an anonymous hand-written letter delivered to her home: "We have given you enough time and you have not done what we told you to do... We had you in our hands, but you do not seem to understand. But we are going to make sure you do understand. We are giving you 8 days to comply. Start counting the days. Think about your parents and about your future. It is not worth dying over something you yourself can prevent happening. Do not leave your house, as we have you under surveillance..."

An Amnesty International delegation which recently visited Guatemala met with the workers to collect first-hand testimonies regarding the harassment they have been suffering. It seems that, despite the threats against Débora Guzmán and her abduction in February, no inquiries have been initiated by the authorities. It is believed that, as occurred in the context of previous labour disputes at Lunafil in 1987 and 1988, private security guards hired by the Lunafil management and acting with the acquiescence or complicity of the Guatemalan security forces may be responsible for the abuses against her and other recent violations against unionists in the textile sector.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters

- expressing concern at the death threats against Débora Guzmán Chupén and Félix González, as well as other workers at the *Lunafil* factory;
- asking the government to take immediate measures to guarantee their safety and that of their families;
- calling on the authorities to initiate immediate investigations into the reported abuses and that the perpetrators be brought to justice.
