GUATEMALA: 11 Journalists under threat of arrest

Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of 11 journalists from the country's main newspapers. According to reports received by Amnesty International the journalists have appeared on a list of people for whom arrest warrants have been issued. Some of those named write for the newspapers, <u>Diario Siglo XXI</u>, <u>Diario Prensa Libre</u>, <u>Diario El Gráfico and <u>Diario La Hora</u>. Another on the list is described as the General Secretary of the Media Union, (Secretario Général del Sindicato del Consejo Nacional de Defensa al Periodista). One is described as a correspondent for Reuter's news agency.</u>

One 25 May 1993 Guatemala's elected president, Jorge Serrano, announced that he had taken certain measures, including partial suspension of the Constitution, suspension of the Supreme Court and the Constitutional Court, dissolution of Congress, and replacement of the rule of law by rule of decree. There were unlawful attempts to arrest leading officials such as the Human Rights Procurator, the President of Congress, the President of the Supreme Court and the acting Attorney General. The offices of a number of the country's major newspapers were surrounded by military troops who prevented newspaper staff from distributing their newspapers. Both radio and television transmissions are reported to have been subjected to censorship.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

These moves have come in the wake of large-scale protests in the capital, Guatemala city. Amnesty International is concerned that targeted groups, including journalists, trade unionists and student leaders and those working with non-governmental organizations, particularly those attempting to investigate and protect human rights, may now be even more vulnerable to human rights violations. These groups of people have been long-term targets of abuses in Guatemala, including harassment, threats, torture, "disappearances", and extrajudicial executions. Amnesty International is also concerned that government officials carrying out human rights initiatives will also be at risk.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish, English or in your own language:

- demanding immediate guarantees that all human rights protected in Guatemala's constitution will be observed;
- demanding that the physical security of the journalists for whom arrest warrants have been issued be guaranteed and calling for the immediate and unconditional release of anyone arrested for their consciously held beliefs and who are known not to have used or advocated violence;
- calling on the government to immediately reestablish the functions of the judiciary, public ministry and legislature designed to protect human rights;
- calling for the rights to freedom of expression to be observed.
