GUATEMALA Amílcar MÉNDEZ URÍZAR

Amnesty International is concerned at renewed threats against Amílcar Méndez Urízar, the president of <u>Consejo de Comunidades Étnicas "Runujel Junam"</u> (CERJ), Council of Ethnic Communities "We are all Equal".

On 8 December, at approximately 9.00am, Amílcar Méndez received an anonymous telephone call, in which the caller accused him of belonging to the guerrillas and telling him to remove a guerrilla banner that had been left in the vicinity of Amílcar Méndez' home. Amnesty International is concerned for the continued safety of Amílcar Méndez.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Amílcar Méndez returned to Guatemala at the end of November, after having left Guatemala for the United States in early September following a series of threats, (See UA 289/91, AMR 34/40/91 of 28 August 1991 and follow-up AMR 34/41/91 of 30 August 1991). On 30 September 1991, at a meeting held in the United States with human rights organizations, including Amnesty International, Guatemalan President Jorge Serrano Elías accused Amílcar Méndez and CERJ of having links with the insurgency. In the past public statements by officials characterizing individuals or organizations as having links with guerrillas have been followed by severe reprisals against those cited, in the form of torture, "disappearance" and extrajudicial execution.

## RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters in SPANISH if possible:

- expressing concern at renewed threats against CERJ president, Amílcar Méndez;
- asking for guarantees for his safety and for the safety of other CERJ members;
- asking for an immediate and impartial investigation into the origin of the anonymous telephone calls;
- urging that the results of the investigation be made public and that those found to be responsible for the threats be brought to justice.
