GUATEMALA: Dra. Brenda MERIDA (female), doctor

Amnesty International is seriously concerned for the safety of Dra. Brenda Mérida who has been receiving anonymous threats since April 1993. She is the doctor and director of a rural medical centre in the municipality of Santa Eulalia, Huehuetenango department.

According to reports, on 23 April 1993, only a week after beginning work at the medical centre, Brenda Mérida received an anonymous telephone call in which the caller said: "Take care, this is your first time". On 26 April a report on the incident was submitted to the Judge of the Peace of Soloma, the human rights office in Huehuetenango, the mayor of Santa Eulalia and the human rights office of the Archbishop of Guatemala.

Subsequently, on 12 May and 26 June the doctor reportedly received further anonymous calls. On 24 July an unidentified man appeared to be watching Brenda Mérida at the medical centre and then left. On 31 July, after a meeting with some health workers, another unidentified man apparently followed the doctor to the town centre and again on 1 August she was reportedly followed by an unknown man. The following week, while sitting in a restaurant in Panajachel, a man reportedly took a photograph of her and then ran from the restaurant.

On 15 June and 2 July denunciations were made to the Minister of Defence and to the President of the Republic, respectively.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The medical centre where Brenda Mérida works, which was established in order to improve health care in the area, is situated on land previously occupied by the local office of the <u>Patrullas de Autodefensa Civil</u>, Civil Defence Patrols (PAC). It was apparently only with the support of the local military that the PAC agreed to move from the land. Another worker at the medical centre has also been harassed; in March 1993 an Italian doctor named Emanuela Saggi was photographed by an unidentified man.

The PAC were created as a component of the military's counter-insurgency strategy in 1982. Although voluntary according to the Constitution, civil patrols are in effect compulsory. Those refusing to take part in them have been branded "guerrillas", and many have been subjected to human rights violations, including harassment and attacks, "disappearance" and extrajudicial execution.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish, English or in your own language:

- expressing concern at the harassment and threats received by Dra. Brenda Mérida;
- asking that these incidents be immediately investigated and that those found responsible be brought to justice;
- asking for guarantees for the safety of Dra. Brenda Mérida.
