UA 462/90 Fear of "disappearance"/torture

GUATEMALA/BELIZE

Luis Arturo AREVALO

Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of Luis Arturo Arévalo, a Guatemalan citizen, who was arrested and reportedly tortured by the Belize police, and then handed over to the Guatemalan military authorities.

According to the information received by Amnesty International, the Guatemalan authorities warned the Belize authorities that Luis Arturo Arévalo, whom they accused of membership of a Guatemalan armed opposition group, had arrived in Belize. Luis Arévalo was captured by the Special Branch of the Belicean security forces between 3 and 4 November 1990, and reportedly subjected to repeated beatings. After about a week, he was reportedly handed over to the <u>Kaibiles</u>, an elite counterinsurgency unit of the Guatemalan security forces, in Melchor de Mengos, El Petén department, Guatemala. Amnesty International fears he may be tortured while in military custody and that he may be extrajudicially executed.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Tens of thousands of people have been victims of human rights violations in Guatemala over the past two decades. Members of all branches of the Guatemalan police and military have been responsible for a wide range of human rights violations against those considered to be government opponents. Trade unionists, academics and students, priests and catechists have been abducted, tortured and killed. Indian villagers have been seized, mutilated and shot dead.

After nearly 20 years of military government, a civilian government was elected in January 1986. However, after a brief decrease in human rights violations, reports of abductions, "disappearances," and political killings escalated throughout the administration of President Vinicio Cerezo. Now, as the administration reaches its closing months (the first round of presidential elections was held on 11 November), abuses have reached levels which some observers consider equal those of any of President Cerezo's military predecessors.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters:

To the Belicean authorities:

- expressing concern at the reports that Luis Arturo Arévalo was tortured by the Belicean authorities;

- expressing concern that he was returned to Guatemala, where there are grounds to believe that he might be subjected to human rights violations by the Guatemalan military authorities;

To the Guatemalan authorities:

- urging the Guatemalan authorities to clarify his whereabouts and legal situation;

- expressing concern that he may be tortured while in the custody of the Guatemalan army, and asking for assurances that his physical integrity will be respected.
