GUATEMALA: Graciela Esther BARRIOS MARROQUIN (f)

Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of Graciela Esther Barrios Marroquín who has reportedly been threatened with death if she does not give up her work in El Quiché department with Cáritas, a Catholic-based international non-governmental organization.

According to information received by Amnesty International, on 19 July 1993, two years after the killing of her husband, Julio Quevedo Quezada, Graciela Esther Barrios received death threats by mail stating that two years before she had been allowed to live but, if she did not give up her work with Cáritas within three months and leave she would be made to "disappear". A similar threat was reportedly made in September 1993 stating that she had one month left. Subsequently, on 20 December 1993 she received her "final warning" that she could suffer the same fate as her sister.

On 10 December 1985, during the administration of General Oscar Humberto Mejía, Beatriz Eugenia Barrios Marroquín, sister of Graciela Esther Barrios, was abducted in Guatemala City. Her mutilated body was found shortly afterwards (see UA 346/85, AMR 34/47/85,11 December 1985; and follow-up AMR 34/48/85, 16 December 1985).

On 15 July 1991, agronomist Julio Quevedo Quezada, husband of Graciela Esther Barrios, was shot dead in Santa Cruz del Quiché by two men.

In both cases, the circumstances of the killings suggest the involvement of the security forces, but both remain unresolved and no serious efforts appear to have been made to bring to justice those responsible.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On 6 June 1993 Ramiro de León Carpio, previously the Human Rights Procurator, was voted President by Congress to serve out the remaining term of President Jorge Serrano Elías. Ex-president Serrano had been forced from office after trying to seize near-dictatorial powers on 25 May 1993. When President de León Carpio came to power there were expectations and hopes in certain quarters that he might be able to improve the human rights situation, due to his previous role as Human Rights Procurator. However, since he assumed office, incidents of threats and intimidation directed at targeted groups, including trade unionists, journalists, and those working with non-governmental organizations have continued.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish, English or your own language:

- expressing concern at the threats received by Graciela Esther Barrios Marroquín;
- asking for an immediate investigation into these threats and that those found responsible be brought to justice;
- asking for guarantees for the safety of Graciela Esther Barrios Marroquín.
