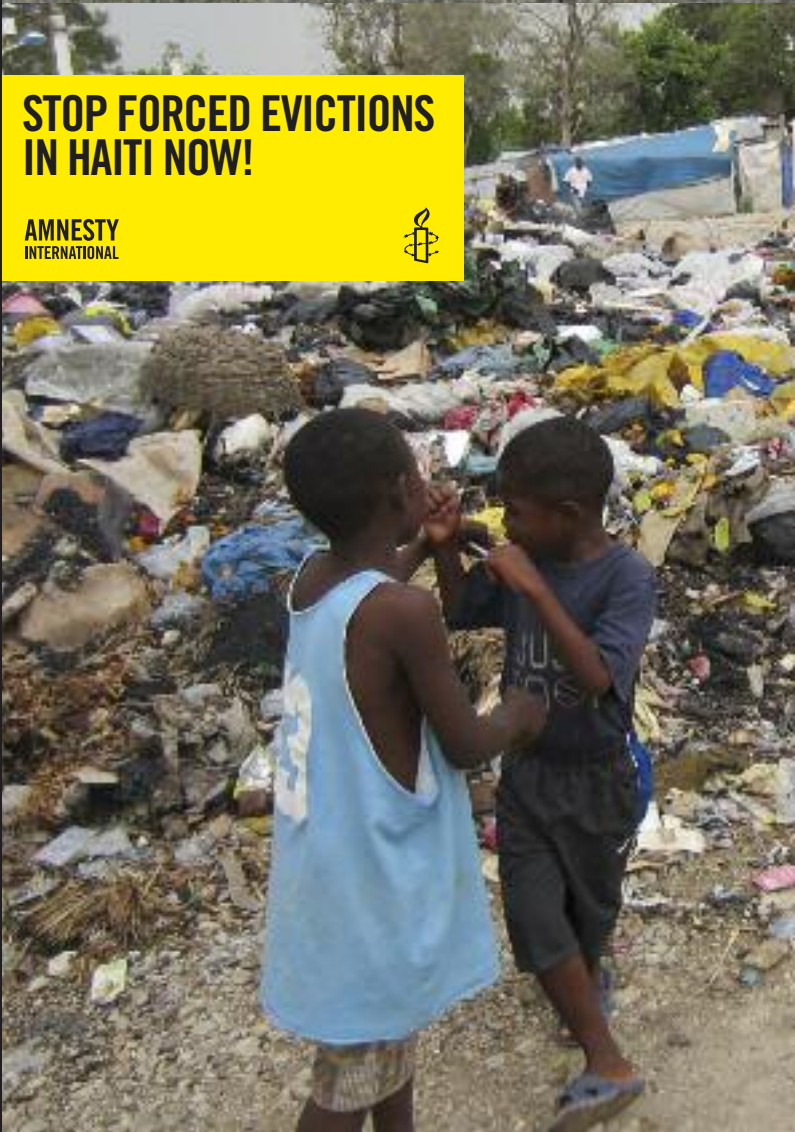


# STOP FORCED EVICTIONS IN HAITI NOW!

Dear President,

I am profoundly concerned that people in Haiti's internal displacement camps are being forcibly evicted, often by the authorities or with their consent. Thousands of families who are desperately seeking to rebuild their lives are living in daily fear of being forcibly evicted without any due process.

I therefore respectfully urge your government to immediately stop all evictions, until proper safeguards are established to comply with international human rights standards.

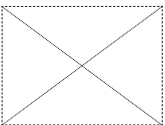
Even though I recognize that the international community must make good on its pledges at the March 2010 donor conference to assist Haiti's reconstruction process, I do believe that you have the primary responsibility to ensure that displaced people's rights are respected and protected and to provide lasting solutions to their housing needs.
