UA 391/91 Ill-treatment/Legal Concern 12 November 1991

HAITI Raymond TOUSSAINT

Amnesty International is seriously concerned for the health and safety of Raymond Toussaint, a member of the <u>Comité National des Congrès des Mouvements</u> <u>Démocratiques</u> (KONAKOM), National Committee of Congress of Democratic Movements, and a rural development group known as CODEP. He was arrested on 25 October 1991 and was reportedly ill-treated.

According to information received by Amnesty International, Raymond Toussaint was arrested without a warrant by uniformed soldiers. They reportedly came to his home in Petite Rivière de l'Artibonite, in Haiti's Artibonite Department, and accused him of "spreading propaganda in favour of President Aristide". Raymond Toussaint was taken to the army barracks in Petite Rivière where he was reportedly severely beaten. He was subsequently transferred to Saint Marc prison, where he is said to be in poor health because of ill-treatment. He is allegedly being denied access to his lawyer or visits by his family.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Troops overthrew the democratically elected government of President Jean-Bertrand Aristide, who took office in Haiti on 7 February 1991, in a coup d'Etat on Monday 30 September. Since then Amnesty International has learned of widespread human rights violations committed by the security forces, including a large number of extrajudicial executions, beatings and mass arrests without warrant. Many of the victims included supporters of President Aristide and members and leaders of grassroots organizations.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/airmail letters:

- expressing concern at the reported ill-treatment in custody of Raymond Toussaint;
- asking that he be provided with immediate and adequate medical treatment while in custody;
- asking for an investigation into allegations of ill-treatment, that the results of the investigation be made public and that those found responsible be brought to justice;
- asking for clarification of his legal situation and if detained for the exercise of his freedom of expression, not involving the advocacy of violence, urge that he be immediately and unconditionally released.
