HAITI Paul-Jean MARIO

Amnesty International is concerned at reports of the arrest without warrant of two journalists. Paul-Jean Mario was arrested in Port-au-Prince on 11 November and Nicolas Sorenville in Mirebalais, Central department on 8 November. Nicolas Sorenville was reportedly transferred to the caserne (military barracks) in Hinche, capital of the Central department. It is not known where Paul-Jean Mario is currently being held. Amnesty International is concerned for the physical safety of both journalists.

Paul-Jean Mario, a journalist with the privately-owned Radio Antilles Internationale in Petit Goâve, South-east department, was reportedly arrested in Port-au-Prince on 11 November 1991 by seven armed men in civilian clothes and a member of the police in uniform. The reason for his arrest is not known. The home of Paul-Jean Mario in Petit Goâve was attacked and burned in the wake of the coup d'Etat, on 30 September 1991, which ousted President Jean-Bertrand Aristide. Paul-Jean Mario, a supporter of President Jean-Bertrand Aristide had fled the area and gone to Port-au-Prince.

Nicolas Sorenville from <u>Radio Nationale</u> (National Radio) was arrested, together with Marcel Beaublanc a journalist with Radio Plus, in Mirebalais, Central department by soldiers on 8 November 1991. Both men were taken to the <u>caserne</u> (military barracks) in Hinche, capital of Central department. Marcel Beaublanc was released on 12 November, but Nicolas Sorneville remains detained.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Troops overthrew the democratically elected government of President Jean-Bertrand Aristide, who took office in Haiti on 7 February 1991, in a coup d'Etat on Monday 30 September. Since then Amnesty International has learned of widespread human rights violations committed by the security forces, including a large number of extrajudicial executions, beatings and mass arrests without warrant. Many of the victims included supporters of President Aristide and members and leaders of grassroots organizations.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/telephone calls/airmail letters:

- expressing concern at the reported arrest without warrant of journalists Paul-Jean Mario and Nicolas Sorenville;
 - asking for information on the whereabouts of Paul-Jean Mario;

- asking for information as to the reasons for their arrest and for clarification of their legal situation;
- asking that if detained that they be humanely treated in custody;
- asking that they be brought before the appropriate judicial authorities, and charged with a recognizably criminal offence or be released.
