Next Sunday 1 December, Mexican President Enrique Peña Nieto's will complete one year in office.

After he came into power, he announced an ambitious programme of reforms. As part of that programme, he promised to tackle the ongoing pattern of human rights abuses in the country and change the poor human rights record of the previous President, Felipe Calderón.

The Mexican government's fine words on human rights bear little resemblance to its actions on the ground. Over this last year, Amnesty International has repeatedly reminded Mexican authorities of of its broken promises.
