MEXICOLayda Sansores Sanromán, political activist and members of her family

Death threats have been made against politician Layda Sansores Sanromán and her family by members of the security forces and the ruling *Partido Revolucionario Institucional* (PRI), Institutional Revolutionary Party, in the city of Campeche, Campeche State. Amnesty International is seriously concerned for their safety.

On 15 October 1997, two men followed Layda Sansores Sanromán and told her that she would be killed if she continued with her activism. The following day, a message was left on the answering machine at her house threatening the whole family with death.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Layda Sansores Sanromán ran for the governorship of Campeche State as the candidate for the *Partido de la Revolución Democrática* (PRD), Party of the Democratic Revolution, a legal opposition party, in elections on 6 July 1997. The election was won by Antonio González Curi, candidate for the PRI amid allegations of serious irregularities. Since then, members of the PRD have staged peaceful demonstrations demanding that Layda Sansores Sanromán be recognised as the state governor. On 11 September, police violently broke up a PRD demonstration and injured 15 people.

The death threats mentioned above form part of a continuing pattern of intimidation against Layda Sansores Sanromán, her family, and members of the PRD in Campeche. High-ranking state officials are alleged to be behind these death threats.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/faxes/express/airmail letters in Spanish or your own language:

- urging for measures to be taken to guarantee the physical integrity of Layda Sansores Sanromán and her family;
- calling for prompt and thorough investigations into the death threats made against Layda Sansores Sanromán and her family, and for those responsible to be brought to justice;
- expressing alarm at the level of intimidation and harassment against members of the PRD in Campeche State.
