USA (Louisiana): Robert SAWYER

Robert Sawyer, who was scheduled to be executed by the state of Louisiana on 15 November 1991, has received an indefinite stay of execution from the United States Supreme Court. The Supreme Court issued the stay so it could consider Sawyer's petition for federal habeas corpus relief.

On 11 November the Louisiana Board of Pardons and Parole had recommended by 3 votes to 2 in favour of clemency after hearing extensive testimony regarding Robert Sawyer's mental retardation, brain disorder and history of mental illness. However, Governor Buddy Roemer refused to follow the Board's clemency recommendation. The execution would have been carried out, had it not been for the unexpected intervention by the United States Supreme Court.

The issue now before the Court is whether Robert Sawyer's well-documented history of mental disabilities and mental illness (which was not presented to the jury at his original trial) renders him "ineligible" for the death penalty.

Although the Governor failed to follow the Board's clemency recommendation, it is felt important to support the Board and encourage them to take a stand in similar cases in the future. Governor Roemer will be leaving office in December and will be replaced by Edwin Edwards.
