**USA Agustín Aguayo (m)**

Prisoner of conscience Agustín Aguayo was released on 18 April. He had been held in a US military prison in Germany.

In March 2007 US Army medic Agustín Aguayo had been sentenced by US court martial to eight months' imprisonment solely for his conscientious objection to participating in the war in Iraq. At the time he was released he was considered to have served six weeks of his sentence, as the time he had spent in custody awaiting trial was taken into account.

His lawyers have filed an appeal against his conviction, and have also filed papers in a US court for a rehearing of his appeal challenging the Army's refusal to grant him an honourable discharge as a conscientious objector.
