USA (New Mexico) Terry Doug Clark (m), white, aged 45

On 6 November, Terry Clark became the first person to be executed in New Mexico since 1960. Hundreds of death penalty opponents held a vigil outside the State Capitol before the execution.

Terry Clark was sentenced to death for the murder of nine-year-old Dena Lynn Gore in 1986. He gave up appeals against his death sentence in March this year and was executed by lethal injection.

In a reply sent to people who had appealed against the execution, New Mexico Governor Gary Johnson wrote: "My mind is not closed on the subject. I will continue to listen and take into consideration the varying opinions. Although I do not intend to declare a moratorium on executions in New Mexico, eliminating the death penalty in the future may prove to be better public policy...".

Terry Clark becomes the $741^{\rm st}$ prisoner to be executed in the USA since it resumed judicial killing in 1977. According to Amnesty International's information, he was the $95^{\rm th}$ person to have been put to death after giving up their appeals. His was the $58^{\rm th}$ execution in the USA this year.
