Arbitrary arrest/fear for safety 30 July 1996

VENEZUELA Jorge Nieves, human rights defender Leticia Echenique (f), human rights defender

Amnesty International is alarmed at the arbitrary arrest of Jorge Nieves and Leticia Echenique, members of the *Comité para la Defensa de los Derechos Humanos* (CODEHUM), a non-governmental human rights organization based in Guasdualito, state of Apure, and is seriously concerned abut their safety and that of other members of their organization. Guasdualito is within the so-called "zonas de seguridad fronteriza", border security zones, where several constitutional guarantees remain suspended and security operations are under the command of the Venezuelan army.

Jorge Nieves and Leticia Echenique were detained on 29 July at the local office of the *Dirección de Inteligencia y Prevención* (DISIP), a police intelligence agency, when they went to enquire about the conditions of detention of Silvano Rivero, who had been held in that office since 28 July. Following their detention, the home of Jorge Nieves was raided without a warrant by the police.

According to the local police, both human rights defenders were detained because their names had appeared on a list of people allegedly conspiring to undermine the security of the state. Reportedly, no charges have been brought against either of them. Amnesty International has well-founded fears for their safety. Earlier this month, representatives of CODEHUM presented a report of human rights violations by the security forces to a visiting Amnesty International delegation. Amnesty International believes that the detention of Jorge Nieves and Leticia Echenique may be in retaliation for this.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Amnesty International (AI) has expressed increasing concern about gross human rights violations by the Venezuelan security forces in vast areas bordering with Colombia. Between 13 and 21 July, an Amnesty International delegation, headed by its Secretary General, visited the country to present a memorandum addressed to President Rafael Caldera which summarized the organization's concerns over the deteriorating human rights situation in the country, especially in the areas bordering with Colombia, defined as "zonas de seguridad fronteriza". During the visit, AI representatives met with several Venezuelan human rights organizations, which support AI's concerns. The human rights defenders participating in that meeting described the increasing pressure they feel and even threats they are suffering from local authorities as a result of their work. Among those present were representatives of CODEHUM, which updated the organization on the sharp increase in serious human rights violations by the security forces, including dozens of recent cases of torture, in Guasdualito and other areas of Apure. They also reported recent incidents of threats against their members by local authorities.

Amnesty International's memorandum was not well received by some authorities. José Guillermo Andueza, the Interior Minister, accused AI's Secretary General of "defending Colombian interests", and General Raúl Salazar Rodríguez, in charge of military operations in the region, completely refuted AI's concerns. Amnesty International is extremely concerned that these statements may indicate a lack of willingness by the authorities to stop human rights violations and ensure full investigations about well-documented abuses committed by the security forces. Moreover, the organization is seriously concerned at the arbitrary detention of human rights defenders working in the region bordering Colombia, who appear to be the last and only recourse of the local population against human rights violations.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in Spanish or in your own language:

- expressing alarm about the arbitrary detention of Jorge Nieves and Leticia Echenique, apparently solely as a result of their work as human rights defenders, and your serious concern for their safety;

- calling for their immediate and unconditional release, and seeking assurances of their physical integrity and security;

- calling for assurances that human rights defenders, their work and organizations will be fully respected by the authorities, in Guasdualito as well as throughout the rest of the Venezuelan territory;

- urging that full investigations be carried out into the arbitrary detention of Jorge Nieves and Leticia Echenique, and into the threats against other members of CODEHUM, and for those responsible to be brought to justice.
