THAILAND/MYANMARForcible return of Burmese refugees to Myanmar

new name: Ah Bo, aged 42

On 2 November 1996 Thai Rangers again repatriated a group of 185 Lahu and Akha refugees to Myanmar. The group of villagers have fled Myanmar three times in October, following raids by the Myanmar army on Ban Ai Long village, Shan State, on 10, 20 and 31 October. On each occasion they have been repatriated after two days by Thai Rangers. Amnesty International fears that the villagers remain at risk of arbitrary detention and possible ill-treatment in Myanmar, and that Ah Bo, a Lahu male villager detained during the army raid of 20 October, may be facing ill-treatment in custody. His current whereabouts are unknown.

Thai Rangers from Pa Sang Nangern Camp, northern Chiang Rai province, had previously repatriated the group on 12 October (see original EXTRA). The commander of Myanmar army battalion 256 reportedly gave Thai Rangers written assurances that he guaranteed the group's safety and that his troops would not persecute them further. However, on 20 October 60 Myanmar army soldiers raided Ban Ai Long village for the second time, interrogated villagers, threatened them with violence, and detained Ah Bo. Following the raid, villagers fled to Thailand, only to be repatriated two nights later by Thai Rangers. Rangers reportedly ensured that the Myanmar army battalion had left the village before they sent the group back. A further Myanmar army raid on the village took place on 31 October. Villagers had received advance warning of the raid and returned to Thailand, from where they were again repatriated by Thai Rangers on 2 November. On this occasion rangers also reportedly ensured that the Myanmar army battalion had left the village before the refugees were returned.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or your own language to:

1. THAI AUTHORITIES

- noting that the Royal Thai Government is bound by the internationally-recognized principle of non-refoulement, which prohibits states from returning refugees against their will to countries where they risk serious human rights violations;
- expressing concern that each time the Thai authorities have returned the group of Ban Ai Long villagers to Myanmar, the village has subsequently been raided by the Myanmar army;
- calling on the Thai authorities to seek assurances from the Myanmar authorities of Ah Bo's safety;
- calling on the Thai authorities to halt the forcible return of Burmese refugees and to grant them the necessary protection.
