Dr Aye Tha Aung released

On Friday 16 August Myanmar authorities announced that they had released Dr Aye Tha Aung and five members of the National League for Democracy.

According to news agency AFP, government spokesperson Colonel Hla Min said that Aye Tha Aung was released on humanitarian grounds. Colonel Hla Min stated that "Aye Tha Aung has been spending most of his time together with his family at Yangon General Hospital taking medical treatment provided for by the government (..)". The *BBC* reported on 16 August 2002 that Aye Tha Aung had told the *BBC* that he would be having an operation for lung cancer on Monday 19 August 2002.

U Thar Ban, Dr Zaw Min, Dr Than Nyein, U Win Tin and Ko Aung Htun remain imprisoned and in need of adequate medical treatment.

Recommended actions & addresses

Please write letters in English to the authorities below, using professionally-headed paper if you use this in your profession:

- introducing yourself as a member of Amnesty International=s health professional network and/or write in your professional capacity
- welcoming the release of Dr Aye Tha Aung
- expressing concern that U Thar Ban, Dr. Zaw Min, Dr. Than Nyein, U Win Tin, and Ko Aung Htun have been imprisoned for their peaceful exercise of the right to freedom of expression, association and assembly, and calling for their immediate and unconditional release from detention

 expressing concern at reports of the deteriorating health of the above prisoners, and urging that pending their release they are given medical treatment according to their individual needs as provided for by international human rights standards, such as the UN Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners (Article 22).
