Eight of the people named above, detained by Military Intelligence in Myanmar since 25 September, have reportedly been released from detention. It is not known why they were chosen to be released.

Those released were among a group of 30 people arrested from their homes at night between 25 September and 2 October. All but four of the 30 people were former political prisoners. Their arrests were allegedly linked to the possession of publications by opposition groups.

It is not known whether any remaining detainees have been charged. They are still at risk of torture and ill-treatment by Military Intelligence.

There are approximately 1,300 political prisoners in Myanmar, most of whom have been arrested for their peaceful political activities. Torture is commonplace during interrogation and pre-trial detention.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send appeals in English or in your own language:

- welcoming reports of the release of eight of those arrested since 25 September;
- expressing concern for the safety of at least 22 others who were arrested between 25 September and 2 October;
- calling on authorities to make public their whereabouts and to ensure that they are not tortured or ill-treated in detention;
- calling on authorities to give details of any charges faced by members of the group, and calling for their immediate and unconditional release unless they are to be charged with a recognizably criminal offence;
- urging the authorities to give them immediate access to their families, lawyers, and any medical attention they may require.
