Yuan Weijing in a message to her husband

Yuan Weijing, aged 32, has been held under 24-hour surveillance at her home since September 2005. Although no formal legal charges have been brought against her, Yuan Weijing and her young daughter, Kesi, are kept as prisoners — she is prevented from receiving visitors and from seeking medical treatment for her chronic toothache.

Yuan Weijing, and her husband Chen Guangcheng, defended the rights of people with disabilites and women affected by abuses such as forced abortion and arbitrary detention as a means of enforcing family planning policies in Linyi city, Shandong province. Yuan Weijing continues to campaign for justice for local residents and for the release of her husband who is serving a prison sentence of four years and three months. Yuan Weijing has not been allowed to visit her husband since June 2007.

- Call for the respect and protection of the rights of human rights defenders like Yuan Weijing and Chen Guangcheng.
