Dear Chairperson.

I am very concerned about the permission granted to the Orissa government's Mining Corporation and Sterlite Industries India Ltd (a subsidiary of Vedanta Resources) to mine bauxite in the Niyamgiri Hills. This project threatens the way of life of the Dongria Kondh, a protected adivasi community. Niyamgiri is sacred and central to their identity, beliefs and traditional way of life. The mine could also impair their rights to water, food, health and work. Yet the Orissa government failed to obtain the Dongria Kondh's free, prior and informed consent — which international standards oblige them to do.

I urge you to:

- withdraw permission to mine in the Niyamgiri Hills.
- thoroughly assess the human rights and environmental impacts of this project in genuine and open consultation with the Dongria Kondh.
- ensure that any proposed development or use of Dongria Kondh land is done only with their consent.
