Amnesty International has learned that the Supreme Court hearing concerning the death sentences passed by the High Court of Andhra Pradesh on Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao is to be on 2 April 1996. It is unclear how long the appeal will take.

Please note the change of officials to address below. Under the Indian Constitution, Governors of states have powers to commute death sentences.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in english or in your own language:

- urging that the death sentences on Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao not be carried out and that their sentences be commuted;
- repeating unconditional opposition to the death penalty as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;
- reiterating that the death penalty has never been shown to have a unique deterrent effect.
