INDIAHuman Rights Defenders in Andhra Pradesh

On 19 February the Andhra Pradesh government announced that there would be a judicial inquiry into the killing of human rights defender Azam Ali. However, they have not yet taken any action.

No judicial officer has been appointed to head the inquiry, and there has been no announcement about its scope. Human rights activists have asked for details of the inquiry, asking that it look into the alleged links between police and the surrendered members of armed groups who killed Azam Ali and T. Puroshottam, but have had no answer.

Amnesty International will be watching the situation closely, and will now shift to longer-term campaigning on this case. Please send a final round of faxes/express/airmail letters in English or your own language:

- expressing grave concern that the Andhra Pradesh government announced in the Legislative Assembly on 19 February that there would be a judicial inquiry into the killing of Azam Ali, but so far appear to have taken no steps to establish the inquiry or begin investigations;
- urging the government to order an independent and impartial investigation into the killing of Azam Ali and T. Puroshottam, and into serious allegations that police have been acting in connivance with those responsible for their killing.
