INDIA: Rajendra Sail, human rights activist and new additional concern: illegal detention of 89 individuals

Amnesty International has now learnt that 89 people were arrested in Raipur, Madhya Pradesh on 2 July 1992 under section 151 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CPC), (prevention of a cognizable offence). These arrests took place on the same day as the organising secretary of the People's Union for Civil Liberties, Rajendra Sail, was arrested under the same section of the CPC.

The 89 people were denied access to a lawyer for at least the first week of their arrest which contravenes international human rights standards (the UN Basic Principles on the role of lawyers specifies that lawyers should have access to detainees within 48 hours of arrest). They were arrested after an incident in Bhilai on 1 July in which police opened fire on striking demonstrators, killing 16 and injuring approximately 100 others.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams and airmail letters

- urging that all 89 people be immediately granted access to a lawyer as required by international human rights standards;

- urging that they be immediately released if they are not to be charged with a recognizably criminal offence.
