#### INDIAGovindaswamy

Govindaswamy has received a stay of execution from the High Court of Tamil Nadu. He had been scheduled to be put to death on 9 November.

At a hearing on 5 November, where Govindaswamy's lawyer filed a petition for a stay of execution, the High Court set a date of 23 November for the President of India and Governor of Tamil Nadu to consider clemency petitions in consultation with the central and state governments.
