INDIA Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao, aged 25 Satuluri Chalapathi Rao, aged 24

On 25 September 1996, the High Court of Andhra Pradesh stayed the execution of Gantela Vijayavardhana Rao and Satuluri Chalapathi Rao. The stay order was passed in response to a writ petition filed by the Andhra Pradesh Civil Liberties Committee, in which they asked that the execution be delayed until the mercy petitions which the two men have filed are heard. The government has been asked by the court to respond to the mercy petitions within two weeks.
