@Appeal for the Release of Chon Kyong-hee

Chon Kyong-hee, 32-year-old art teacher and editor, is serving a three-year sentence under the National Security Law (NSL) for belonging to an "anti-state" organization. Amnesty International believes that Chon Kyong-hee is held for the non-violent exercise of her rights to freedom of expression and association and is calling for her immediate and unconditional release.

Chon Kyong-hee was arrested in April 1992 because she belonged to Sanomaeng (Socialist Workers League), an organization which has been defined by the authorities as "anti-state". Under the NSL an "anti-state" organization is defined as a group "with the structure of command and control, organized for the purpose of assuming a title of the government or disturbing the state". This broad definition has been widely interpreted by the courts and often used to imprison people with left-wing views and those with views considered to be similar to those of the North Korean Government. Since 1990 over 200 Sanomaneg members have been arrested, around 50 of whom remain in prison today.

Amnesty International believes there is no evidence to support accusations that Chon Kyong-hee and other members of the group had planned to overthrow the state using violence, as claimed by the authorities. *Sanomaeng*, which said it sought to set up a political party, has stated its commitment to using non-violent methods of political activism.

Chon Kyong-hee is a practising Christian. She studied nutrition at university and later taught at an art college. She also worked as an editor at a publishing company specializing in social science books. It was here that she met her future husband, Baik Tae-ung, the alleged leader of *Sanomaeng* who is now serving a 15-year prison term for leading an "anti-state" organization and is also a prisoner of conscience. The couple married in July 1992 shortly after their arrest but are held in separate prisons. Chon Kyong-hee is in Chongju Prison.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: please send letters and faxes:

- expressing concern that Chon Kyonghee is a prisoner of conscience, held for the non-violent exercise of her rights to freedom of expression and association;
- calling for her immediate and unconditional release.
