PHILIPPINESPresident Ramos signs lethal injection bill into law

On 20 March President Fidel Ramos signed into law Republic Act No. 8177 which provides for execution by lethal injection. The new law stipulates that executions are to be carried out no earlier than one year and no later than 18 months following confirmation of a death sentence by the Supreme Court. During the signing ceremony President Ramos is reported to have said: "Let the criminals beware. The state will continue to pursue criminals without let-up and will not hesitate to execute those upon whom the death sentence has been imposed."

There are now reported to be at least 131 convicts on death row, most of whom are believed to be waiting for their appeals to be heard by the Supreme Court.

- urging the authorities to commute all death sentences however heinous the crimes and to abolish the death penalty.
