

Dear President,

At least 10 media workers have been unlawfully killed in Sri Lanka since the beginning of 2006. Others have been arbitrarily detained, tortured and allegedly disappeared while in the custody of security forces.

Amnesty International is unaware of any investigation that has led to the arrest and prosecution of those responsible for the killing of journalists and other media workers.

I therefore urge the Sri Lankan government to:

- **Protect** media workers and their rights to life, liberty and security of person, in compliance with Sri Lanka's obligations under international law;
- Respect media workers and publicly announce that killings, threats, or other attacks will not be tolerated;
- Investigate all cases of attacks, disappearances and killings of media workers promptly, independently, impartially and effectively, irrespective of the identity of perpetrators or victims;
- Invite the Special Rapporteur on the promotion and protection of the right to freedom of opinion and expression to visit the country without delay. Yours sincerely,
