Further information on UA 383/90 (ASA 37/37/90, 20 September 1990) - "Disappearance"

Sri Lanka: Kumaraguru KUGAMOORTHY

Amnesty International has received further information regarding the "disappearance" of Kumaraguru Kugamoorthy. Contrary to the information provided earlier, it appears that he was arrested on 6 September (not 13 September). The full registration number of the Mitsubishi jeep in which he was taken away was $\underline{9}$ SRI 9164. The date on which the police came to his home with the information regarding his motorbike having been found is 10 September (not 17).

Amnesty International has been able to establish that Kumaraguru Kugamoorthy, who is from Jaffna but has worked in Colombo as a program producer for the Sri Lanka Broadcasting Cooperation, was an active member of several human rights organizations. He was also a member of the Ceylon Mercantile Union. He married only recently and his wife is expecting their first child.

Despite continued efforts to trace his whereabouts, friends and relatives have so far not been able to establish his place of detention. In responses to appeals made by local human rights organizations, both the Criminal Investigation Department and the Police Headquarters, on 22 and 24 September respectively, have denied that they have arrested him.

PLEASE ORGANIZE APPEALS FROM TRADE UNIONISTS, JOURNALISTS AND LOCAL HUMAN RIGHTS ORGANIZATIONS.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters:

The original UA was limited to ten appeals per section because it was thought at that time that a huge number of appeals could be counter-productive. It is now felt that because of the length of time since Kumaraguru Kugamoorthy disappeared, wide international pressure is necessary. Therefore this follow-up is unlimited.

- expressing concern about the "disappearance of Kumaraguru Kugamoorthy after his arrest on 6 September;
- urging that a full, independent inquiry be immediately established to reveal his whereabouts;
- seeking assurances that if he is in custody he be humanely treated and granted immediate and regular access to lawyers and relatives;
- urging that he be released without delay unless he is to be brought to trial promptly and fairly on recognizably criminal charges.
