THAILANDDaw Khin Hlaing (f) U Ye Gaung, aged 71, journalist

In spite of reports that Thai Immigration officials had agreed to release Burmese asylum-seekers Daw Khin Hlaing and U Ye Gaung, the couple are still being held in Bangkok's Immigration Detention Centre (IDC). Amnesty International's concern is heightened by the fact that Daw Khin Hlaing is having difficulty walking and is not receiving proper medical care for her heart condition and related illnesses. The organization is renewing its calls on the Thai authorities to release the two immediately.

Apparently, the couple have paid a fee to cover the cost of their transport to Mae Sot, a town near the Thai/Myanmar border. Nevertheless they are still in detention and are not likely to be released for another two weeks. FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or in your own language: - urging the Thai authorities to immediately release U Ye Gaung and Daw Khin Hlaing, particularly in view of the latter's health problems; - urging the Thai authorities to cease the practice of routinely arresting

- urging the Thai authorities to cease the practice of routinely arresting Burmese and other asylum-seekers.
