Amnesty International fears that Wong Chi Shing may soon be executed following President Le Duc Anh's recent rejection of the appeal to commute his death sentence.

Wong Chi Shing, who is a Hong Kong resident with a British passport, was convicted of smuggling heroin. On 28 May 1993 the People's Supreme Court in Ho Chi Minh City imposed the death penalty on him.
