Amnesty International is concerned for the safety of around 20 people who have been taken into police custody in Van.

According to testimony given by their children, Ferzende and _irin Abi were detained at their home in the Hac_bekir district of Van by officers from the Van Police Headquarters. Ferzende Abi, who suffers from a heart condition, was reportedly so severely beaten with rifle butts that one of his arms and and one of his legs were fractured. According to reports his condition deteriorated in custody and he went into a coma. He was transferred on 5 May to the Van State Hospital where he is being treated in intensive care.

Ferzende Abi is a former board member of the Hakkari branch of the now defunct Democracy Party (DEP). He and irin Abi have seven children.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

People suspected of offences under the Anti-Terror Law can be held in police custody without access to family, friends or legal counsel for up to 30 days in the 10 provinces under State of Emergency in the east and southeast such as Van, and for 15 days in the rest of Turkey. When not being interrogated, detainees are held in cramped, airless and insanitary conditions. With no access to the outside world they are at the mercy of their interrogators. Torture is often applied to extract confessions, to elicit information about illegal organizations, to intimidate detainees into becoming police informers or as informal punishment for assumed support of illegal organizations.

Torture methods include being stripped naked and blindfolded, hosing with pressurized ice-cold water, hanging by the arms or wrists bound behind the victim's back, electric shocks, beating the soles of the feet, death threats and sexual assault.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English or your own language:

- expressing concern for the safety of _irin Abi, Bazi Bor, Ahmet Abi, Aziz Timur and the people held with them in incommunicado detention at Van Police Headquarters;
- seeking assurances that they are not being subjected to torture or any other form of ill-treatment;
- expressing particular concern for the health of Ferzende Abi, transferred on 5 May from police custody to intensive care in Van State Hospital;
- requesting to be informed of any charges against the detainees.
