UA 209/91 Fear of Torture

On the evening of 13 June, the People's Legal Aid Bureau (<u>Halkin Hukuk</u> <u>Bürosu</u>) was raided by the police, reportedly on the orders of the Public Prosecutor, who was present during the search of the premises. The two lawyers, Cavidan Kocaacar, former President of the Solidarity Association of Prisoners' Relatives (TAYAD), and Murat Demir, are said to have been dragged into the police van while being beaten. The reason for their detention is not known. They are being held at Ankara Police Headquarters and it is feared that they may be interrogated under torture.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Turkey ratified the European Convention for the Prevention of Torture on 25 February 1988 and the UN Convention Against Torture on 2 August 1988. However, all information available to Amnesty International indicates that torture is still widespread and systematic in Turkey. Allegations of torture have continued since the transfer of power to a civilian government in 1983. Most allegations relate to ill-treatment of detainees in police custody during their initial interrogation when they are usually denied access to relatives or a lawyer. Under current legislation the maximum detention period before being formally charged or released is 24 hours; in cases involving three or more suspects or due to the 'nature of the crime' it may be extended to 15 days. This period may be extended to 30 days in areas under emergency legislation or martial law. Emergency legislation is currently in force in ten provinces in the southeast.

In August 1990, the Turkish government derogated from Articles 5, 6, 8, 10, 11 and 13 of the European Convention on Human Rights, all of which contain important safeguards for human rights.

# RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters:

- urging that the lawyers Cavidan Kocaacar and Murat Demir are given prompt access to their families and lawyers and that they are not ill-treated while in detention;

- requesting to be informed of any charges against them.
