TURKEY: smail Hakk Kocakaya, father of seven children

At 3pm on 23 November 1991, _smail Kocakaya, a member of Turkey's Kurdish minority, was detained in the Esenler district of Diyarbak_r in the presence of his son Özeyir Kocakaya and brother Yavuz Kocakaya. Several plainclothes police officers, armed and equipped with radios, emerged from a white _ahin type car, registration 21 EF 916 (not 21 ET 916 as indicated in UA 414/91). Two of the officers were known to the family who were able to name one of them. It is alleged that the white car, together with another, a dark red _ahin, registration number 21 EC 519, had apparently been used in observing _smail Kocakaya for several days. One of the officers reportedly said "We are detaining you" and immediately took smail Kocakaya away.

On 25 November, a body was found some 100 kilometres west of Diyarbak_r, under a bridge in the Karacada_ area of Siverek. It was taken to the State Hospital. The body reportedly bore marks of torture. Part of the head was crushed and the eyes were badly wounded.

The family have taken the body to the family home in Lice, 90 km from Diyarbak_r, where the atmosphere is already reported to be tense.

It is reported that _smail Kocakaya was imprisoned from 1980 to 1986 on political charges, and that he had been detained in the same connection three times since 1986. No further details are available.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

During 1991 there have been numerous allegations of extrajudicial executions in Turkey, arising in particular from the southeast of the country where most of the Kurdish minority live.

In June and July 1991, a bombing campaign by unknown persons against members of the Turkish Human Rights Association resulted in injury but not loss of life. At the same time a number of local politicians were murdered in circumstances which remain unclear but have given rise to allegations of extrajudicial execution. In July, Vedat Aydin, a member of the Human Rights Association and President of the Diyarbak_r branch of the People's Labour Party (HEP) - a party perceived as representing the interests of Turkey's large Kurdish

minority - was taken from his house in Diyarbak_r by several armed men, ostensibly plainclothes police officers. Three days later his body was found at a roadside some 60 kilometres north of Diyarbak_r bearing signs of torture and eight gunshot wounds. The body was buried under police supervision within hours of being found and without a full autopsy in spite of the fact that it was clearly a case of murder. There were doubts as to the thoroughness of the initial police investigation into the circumstances of Vedat Ayd_n's death.
