Amnesty International has learned that Am\_e Koç and \_ükrüye Koç have been formally arrested and are now held in Diyarbak\_r prison. They are not thought to be in further danger. Süleyman Koç, Seyithan Koç, M. Nezir Koç, Ahmet Alpergin, Tahir Alpergin, Rifat Önal and Abdo Erdo\_an are still held in detention at Mardin Police Headquarters and have not been given an opportunity to appoint legal counsel, nor have they been granted access to their families. It is reported that they are being subjected to ill-treatment, and that Seyithan Koç has two broken teeth. The others named above have been released without charge.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Turkey has a Kurdish ethnic minority which is not officially recognized by the authorities, but is estimated to number some 10 million people. The Kurdish population lives mainly in southeastern Turkey. Frequent allegations of torture and ill-treatment have been received from the region and the number of torture allegations increased substantially after the 1980 military coup. Since August 1984, when Kurdish guerrillas – members of the Kurdish Workers' Party (PKK) – started armed attacks, an alarming number of reports of ill-treatment of detainees by the security forces have come from the eastern and southeastern provinces, where more than 2000 lives so far have been lost in the continuing fighting.

## FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters:

- urging that the remaining seven detainees held in Mardin Police Headquarters are given an opportunity to appoint legal counsel and prompt access to their families;
- urging that they are not ill-treated while in detention;
- requesting to be informed of any charges against them, and the two women who have already been arrested.
