Amnesty International has learned from a reliable unofficial source that Ashirgeldy Sadyyev has had his death sentence commuted to a long prison term (believed to be 15 or 20 years). He was among 222 death row prisoners whose sentences were commuted under the terms of an amnesty decree issued by President Saparmurad Niyazov on 21 June 1997. Official confirmation of the commutation of these death sentences and of the names of those who it affects is currently being sought by the Urgent Action network working on death penalty cases in Turkmenistan.

Concerns that the charges of drug trafficking, of which Ashirgeldy Sadyyev was convicted, are a politically-motivated fabrication are also being investigated by Amnesty International through other action techniques.

Thank you to all who sent appeals on behalf of Ashirgeldy Sadyyev and contributed to saving his life. No further action is required from the Urgent Action network.
