Amnesty International has learned that Hojjatoleslam val muslimin Mohammad Fazel Mohammad al-Saffar was released from detention on 4 January 1997, and that Mohammad Ghaffari was released on 30 October 1996.

According to reports, Hojjatoleslam val muslimin Sayed Morteza Shirazi was released temporarily on 1 January 1997 and his brother, Sayed Mehdi, was released temporarily on 28 December 1996. It is not known whether any date has been set for their return to detention. Sayed Mehdi Shirazi is said to be ill, with bladder damage, the failure of one kidney, memory loss and permanent vertigo. Amnesty International fears that both may be at risk of being taken back into detention, particularly as Sayed Morteza Shirazi was previously released for less than 48 hours.

There is still no information as to the fate of seven students arrested on 12 November 1995. Hojjatoleslam val muslimin Mohammad Taqi Dhakeri, Hojjatoleslam Fu'ad Fujian, Hadi Dhakeri and Hojjatoleslam Mohammad Saleh Hedayati are still held in detention. Their legal status remains unclear. Amnesty International is concerned that those detained may be held solely on account of their relationship to, or their peaceful support for, Grand Ayatollah Shirazi. If so, they would be prisoners of conscience, and should be released immediately and unconditionally. In any event, they should be allowed regular access to family members and to lawyers of their choice. In addition, the organization is concerned that these men, and others who have since been released, have been tortured, and that if they are tried and convicted some could face the death penalty.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/ airmail letters in English, French or in your own language:

- welcoming the release of Hojjatoleslam val muslimin Mohammad Fazel Mohammad al-Saffar and Mohammad Ghaffari;

- seeking clarification of the legal situation of those who have been temporarily released;

- seeking details of the legal status of all those who remain in detention including full details of all the charges and evidence against them and details of any trial proceedings, judgements and sentences;

- urging that those remaining in detention be released if not promptly and fairly tried on recognizably criminal charges; any prisoners of conscience should be released immediately and unconditionally.
