Amnesty International has learned that Ali Ardalan, Nezameddin Movahed and seven others imprisoned at the same time were pardoned and released in early April 1992. They had been arrested in June 1990 for having signed an open letter to President Rafsanjani critical of Iranian government policies. Amnesty International had adopted all nine as prisoners of conscience and had repeatedly called for their release from prison. Ali Ardalan, who is aged 76, suffers from ischaemic heart disease and in 1991 was reported to have suffered kidney failure. Nezameddin Movahed, aged 74, suffers from coronary heart disease and arthrosis of the spinal column and knees. Both had been hospitalized in late 1991.

The nine men were pardoned and released on the occasion of the 13th anniversary of the establishment of the Iranian Republic of 1 April. Amnesty International is currently seeking official confirmation that their release is unconditional and that they are not subject to any physical restrictions. Those released in addition to Ali Ardalan and Nezameddin Movahed are Dr Habibollah Davaran, Abdolali Bazargan, Khosrow Mansourian, Akbar Zarinehbaf, Mohammad Tavassoli Hojati, Hashem Sabbaghian and Abol Fazl Mir Shams Shahshahani.

No further action is requested at present. Thank you to all who have appealed on their behalf over the last two years.
