IRANVahid Ghadimi, aged 47

Amnesty International fears that Vahid Ghadimi may be at risk of imminent execution. According to Iranian newspaper reports, he has been sentenced to death, possibly by an Islamic Revolutionary Court, after being convicted of crimes including at least three murders, various armed robberies, drug-related offences and cooperating with groups abroad which advocate the overthrow of the present government. The sentence is reported to have been confirmed by the Supreme Court. Vahid Ghadimi is said to have been sought by the authorities since escaping from prison in 1965 after conviction for robbery.

Amnesty International, while recognizing the rights and responsibilities of governments to bring to justice those responsible for crimes, opposes the death penalty in all cases as the ultimate violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman and degrading punishment as set out in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English, French or your own language:

- urging that the death sentence against Vahid Ghadimi and all other pending death sentences in Iran be commuted;
- drawing attention to world trends to abolish or reduce the use of the death penalty, the desirability of which was reaffirmed in Resolution 32/61 of 8 December 1977 of the United Nations General Assembly.
