JORDAN Muhammad Mire'

In July 1999 the Criminal Court sentenced Muhammad Mire' to death after finding him guilty of the robbery and murder of Muhammad Ziad in Amman on 18 June 1998. The court also sentenced two men and one youth to terms of imprisonment with hard labour for their involvement in the attack.

The case will be reviewed by the Court of Cassation within 30 days. If the Court of Cassation upholds the death penalty it will be referred to King 'Abdallah bin Hussein for ratification.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

After six months during which there were no executions, four people were executed in one week in June 1999. Amnesty International wrote to His Majesty King 'Abdallah bin Hussein, condemning the executions and reiterating its request to His Majesty to work towards the abolition of the death penalty and to introduce an effective moratorium on its use.

Amnesty International does not in any way condone violent crime, but opposes the death penalty in all cases as the ultimate form of cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment. Capital punishment has never been shown to have a unique deterrent effect and a death sentence is irrevocable.

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS: Please send telegrams/faxes/express/airmail letters in English, Arabic or your own language:

- expressing sympathy for the victims of violent crimes and their families and acknowledging the role of governments in bringing the perpetrators of such crimes to justice, but expressing unconditional opposition to the death penalty, which has never been shown to have a unique deterrent effect and which is brutalizing to all involved in its application;
- urging His Majesty King 'Abdallah bin Hussein to commute the death sentence on Muhammad Mire';
- urging that no more executions be carried out in Jordan and that the government work towards abolishing the death penalty.
