SAUDI ARABIANine Saudi Arabian Nationals

Nine Saudi Arabian nationals are to be flogged for "deviant sexual behaviour", according to an Associated Press (AP) report.

On 16 April AP reported that five people had been sentenced to 2,600 lashes and six years' imprisonment, and four to 2,400 lashes and five years' imprisonment. The information apparently came from a police officer speaking on condition of anonymity, and mentioned no names or further details.

On 19 April Amnesty International wrote to the Saudi Arabian Minister of Interior, seeking clarification of the report, and appealed to the government not to carry out the floggings. Amnesty International also sought details of the charges against the nine to assess whether they were prisoners of conscience. As usual the government has not replied, demonstrating yet again that victims of human rights violations in Saudi Arabia must suffer in secrecy.

Flogging is mandatory in Saudi Arabia for a number of offences, including sexual offences, and can also be used at the discretion of judges as an alternative or addition to other punishments. Sentences can range from dozens to thousands of lashes.

Amnesty International considers the punishment of flogging to be cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment amounting to torture, in contravention of Article 5 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which states that "No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment".

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express/airmail letters in English, Arabic or your own language:

-expressing concern at the Associated Press report that nine people are to be flogged, and, if it is true, calling for the sentences not to be carried out;

-asking to know the precise charges against the nine, together with details of their trial proceedings and the evidence produced against them, and to know whether they have been allowed defence lawyers of their own choosing, and whether they are allowed appeal against their convictions and sentences;

-stating that you consider the use of flogging as punishment to be cruel, inhuman and degrading, contrary to Article 5 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which states: "No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment."
