On 31 March, prisoners of conscience Muhannad al-Dabas and Muhammad 'Arab were released from Adra Prison, just outside the capital Damascus. It has been reported that their release followed President Bashar al-Asad's refusal to ratify their sentences.

The two men had served less than four weeks of a three-year prison sentence handed down by the Supreme State Security Court (SSSC) after a grossly unfair trial. They were arrested on 24 April 2004 after a sit-down protest organized by students at the University of Damascus against a new government policy ending guaranteed employment of engineering graduates by the state. They were convicted of "opposing the objectives of the revolution".
