Tunisia:Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem

Amnesty International is gravely concerned that Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem who continues to be held in prolonged incommunicado *garde à vue* detention might be at risk of losing his eyesight.

Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem suffers from a serious eye problem with progressive degeneration of the retina which is likely to deteriorate if not treated. Doctors he had consulted have noted the seriousness of his case and have recommended laser treatment. Should Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem not receive immediate medical treatment his condition could deteriorate and result in blindness.

Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem was arrested on the 7 February 1992 and is being held incommunicado garde à vue detention at Gabes Police Station beyond the maximum 10-day period allowed by Tunisian law. No charges have as yet been brought against him but it is thought his detention might be linked to his imprisonment in 1987 on charges of membership of an unauthorized organization. It is believed that his eye condition dates back from his time in prison in 1987.

Amnesty International is concerned that he is being severely tortured while being held incommunicado detention. Over the past 18 months, thousands of Tunisians belonging to unauthorized organizations have been arrested, tortured and held incommunicado for protracted periods.

FURTHER RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters:

- expressing concern that Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem who suffers from detached retina is not receiving medical treatment and that his condition will drastically deteriorate should he not receive any treatment;

- urging that Azzeddine Hadj Belgaccem be immediately released unless charged with a recognizably criminal offence and brought to trial;

- expressing concern that Azzeddine Hadj Belgacem is being held in illegally prolonged garde \grave{a} vue detention
