ISRAEL AND THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES: AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL CONDEMNS HOSTAGE-TAKING OF ISRAELI SOLDIER

Amnesty International is condemning the hostage-taking of an Israeli soldier this week by the Islamic Resistance Movement (Hamas).

Nachshon Waxman, aged 20, was allegedly taken prisoner near Ben Gurion international airport, outside Tel Aviv on 9 October. Israeli television broadcast a video tape of a masked Palestinian claiming to belong to Hamas' armed wing, who produced Nachshon Waxman's identity card and said the soldier would be killed unless Israel released two imprisoned Hamas leaders, as well as scores of jailed Islamist militants. Also included in the statement were two prominent leaders of the Hizbullah movement in south Lebanon also held in Israel.

Amnesty International takes no position on the legitimacy of resorting to arms in pursuit of political aims. However, it opposes human rights abuses such as the taking of hostages and torture or killing of prisoners by either governments or armed opposition groups.

Amnesty International is appealing to Hamas to release Nachshon Waxman as he is being held as a hostage in order to obtain the release of imprisoned Hamas leaders and Islamist militants, and has urged that he be treated humanely and not be subjected to any form of torture or ill-treatment.

Amnesty International has sought assurances that he will not be killed. Hostage-taking and violence to prisoners are forbidden by international human rights and humanitarian law.
