## MIGRANTS IN DANGER AS WOMAN FOUND DEAD

The body of a female migrant from Honduras has been found near the San Juan Diego migrants' shelter in Lecheria, Mexico state. Amnesty International is gravely concerned about migrants travelling through the area.

María Marisol Ortiz Hernández visited San Juan Diego migrants' shelter with her son for a short period of time on 30 September and returned again on 1 October. She told the priest who runs the shelter that she was trying to return to Honduras and wanted to be repatriated. However, at the time María Marisol Ortiz Hernández had been granted a temporary visa by the National Migration Institute of Mexico. Two weeks later, María Marisol Ortiz Hernández's body was found by the side of the train tracks in Lecheria with injuries indicating strangulation.

María Marisol Ortiz Hernández's body was found close to the place where the body of a Guatemalan migrant, **Julio Fernando Cardona Agustín**, was found in August. According to witnesses, the injuries sustained suggest that he was beaten to death in the head.

Amnesty International believes that criminal gangs preying on vulnerable migrants travelling through the Lecheria area are operating with impunity and the authorities have not done enough to combat their activities and improve protection for migrants.

#### Please write immediately in Spanish or your own language:

- Call for a full, prompt and impartial investigation into the murders of María Marisol Ortiz Hernández and Julio Fernando Cardona Agustín and for those responsible to be brought to justice;
- Express concern for the safety of migrants, particularly women and children, travelling through Lecheria, Mexico state;
- Call for immediate protection measures for staff, volunteers and migrants at the San Juan Diego migrants' shelter, to be implemented in accordance with their wishes.

## MIGRANTS IN DANGER AS WOMAN FOUND DEAD

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Hundreds of thousands of irregular migrants (those without official travel documents) attempt to travel through Mexico from Central and South America every year to reach the USA. Many are detained by the Mexican migration authorities and returned to their countries of origin. Amnesty International recently visited Mexico to investigate reports of human rights violations against these people. During the visit, Amnesty International found that many had been kidnapped by gangs, sometimes with the complicity of local officials. Criminal gangs are also involved in trafficking. Impunity for abuses against migrants, who are extremely vulnerable, has allowed these abuses to increase, despite government commitments to ensure respect of migrants' rights.
