## Bonn II: Don't sacrifice human rights in Afghanistan exit

On December 5, the international community meets in Bonn to discuss the future of Afghanistan.

Ten years since the first Bonn conference, Amnesty International is calling on the international community to stand by commitments to protect women's rights and human rights, as the Afghan government and its international partners forge ahead with reconciliation with the Taleban and transition of security to the Afghan forces.

Horia Mosadiq, Amnesty International's Afghanistan Researcher will be available for interview in Bonn from December 2.

Horia Mosadiq is an Afghan woman activist and journalist with more than 15 years experience of national and international advocacy on human rights, justice and gender issues in Afghanistan. She previously played a leading role in Afghan human rights agencies, winning awards for her work. In 2007 she brought victims of war crimes to testify before the Afghan president. She has been victimised for her work as a human rights defender, and is a survivor of human rights abuses experienced while living in Afghanistan. Languages: English, Farsi, Pashto, Urdu
