Summary

Dr Beko Ransome-Kuti, a medical doctor, former head of the Nigerian Medical Association, and a human rights and pro-democracy activist, was arrested on 27 July 1995. He is currently serving a 15-year-sentence following a secret trial by a military tribunal. Dr Frederick Fasehun, also a medical doctor and Dr Ransome-Kuti's successor as acting chairperson of the Campaign for Democracy, was arrested on 18 December 1996 and has been charged with treason with 15 others, for alleged involvement in recent bombings in Nigeria. Those charged include Nobel Laureate Wole Soyinka and three other exiles. Amnesty International regards Dr Ransome-Kuti and Dr Fasehun as prisoners of conscience and is calling for their immediate and unconditional release.

Recommended Actions

Letters are requested from health professionals to the addresses below:

- expressing concern at the imprisonment of Dr Beko Ransome-Kuti and Dr Frederick Fasehun and at their harsh and health threatening prison conditions
- o seeking information about their current situation including their state of health
- urging that they be given full rights of access to a lawyer, doctor and to family members, and be given appropriate medical care;
- calling for the immediate and unconditional release of Dr Beko Ransome-Kuti and Dr Frederick Fasehun on the grounds that they are prisoners of conscience imprisoned for the non- violent expression of their political views
