In addition to Evariste Menouga and Peter William Mandio, another journalist has recently been arrested. Daniel Atangana, a journalist on an independent weekly newspaper, *Le Front Indépendant*, was arrested on 10 December 1996.

His arrest follows an article which appeared in *Le Front Indépendant* on 2 December about the commander of the presidential guard. Josué Banga Kack, the editorial director of *Le Front Indépendant*, had been arrested on 4 December and held for 48 hours before being released without charge.

The director of publication of *Le Front Indépendant*, Peter William Mandio, also a journalist on the newspaper *Le Nouvel Indépendant*, was also arrested on 4 December and remains in detention. Evariste Menouga, also working for *Le Nouvel Indépendant*, was arrested on 27 November following an article in *Le Nouvel Indépendant* which criticized the Minister of Public Works.

All three journalists are being held by the gendarmerie in Yaoundé. Their detention has exceeded the 72 hours allowed by law before a detainee must be brought before a judicial authority to be charged or released.

Restrictions of freedom of expression have intensified in Cameroon during 1996. At least seven journalists have been sentenced to prison terms; others have been held without charge. Newspapers have been suspended. In some cases there have been serious irregularities in judicial procedures; prosecutions against journalists appear to be attempts to inhibit criticism of prominent government members, those closely associated with them or government policies.
