Godwin Agbroko was released on 6 May 1997. He had been detained without charge or trial since 18 December 1996. He said that he had been chained throughout his detention. He had been detained for publishing an report about divisions within the military. He said after his release that the authorities had not disputed the facts of his report, but had wanted to find out the source of his information.

If you can, please send letters:

- welcoming the release but expressing concern that Godwin Agbroko was reportedly chained throughout his detention;
- expressing concern at the lack of any safeguards against ill-treatment of detainees and calling on the government to restore rights of access by detainees to the courts as well as visiting rights by family and lawyers.
